## Year 2 Learning at home

Please choose and complete one activity a day.

Plan and write a story. Think about characters, setting and plot. Plan your story using a story mountain or a storyboard. When writing your story make sure it has a beginning, middle and end.

Get baking and make something with an adult. You could make a cake or your favourite dinner.

Write a recipe to teach someone else how to make it. Include a 'you will need list' and step by step bullet points on how to make it.

Think about a day you've really enjoyed. Write a recount of the day.

Where did you go?

What did you do?

What happened first?

How did the day end?

Why did you enjoy the day?

Write a diary of your week. Create a little book. Write a few sentences about each day.

Questions to think about...

What did you do?

What did you have to eat?

How do you feel? Describe your feelings.

To make a diary. Get two pieces of A4 paper and fold them in half to make a book. Write the days of the week on the top of each page. You could draw a box for a picture and draw lines for your writing.

Choose an animal and research it with an adult. Create a fact file on your chosen animal. Try to include some interesting facts.

Questions to think about...

Where does it live?

What is its habitat like?

What predators does it have?

Create a new invention. Label the different parts or your design. Explain why it is a new invention and why you think it is important.

What is your invention for?

What will it do?

What does each part do?

What is it used for?

Choose one of your favourite books and write a book review.

Questions to think about...

Who wrote the book?

Who did the illustrations?

What rating would you give the book out of 5?

What do you like about the book?

Who is the main character?

What is the book about?

Choose your favourite traditional tale and rewrite the story in your own words. You could present this as a storyboard or make your own book with illustrations.

Choose a country you want to find more information about. Research it with an adult and make an information leaflet about it.

Things to include if you want to...

Continent, capital city, flag, language, traditional food, climate and weather, animals that live there.

To make your leaflet, fold a piece of paper into three or four. You can decide where to draw pictures and lines for your writing. You will need to think about what each part of your leaflet is about.
